On Thursday we took the wonderful 7H to Ibstock Place School for a day of exciting and diverse workshops. From Classics, to digital media; from art to Design and Technology-students were able to take an active role in using the amazing resources available at Ibstock to design and produce work that showed off their impressive academic and creative skills. In the green screen room, small groups recorded and edited a short advertisement in an 'Apprentice style' task that resulted in a lot of laughter! Outside in the open spaces, students were gifted with sketchbooks and watercolours to be inspired by their natural surroundings. In design technology, students created a new unique key-ring in just under 30 minutes. At the end of the day, we were able to watch a matinee performance of the 'Terrible Tales', put on by the KS3 Ibstock students in their theatre. We even had the treat of some delicious ice cream to enjoy as we sat in the audience. We are very lucky to have our ongoing Hurlingham partnership with Ibstock Place, where some of our Year 11 students achieve fully funded scholarships to attend this quality Sixth Form . I know that 7H are now feeling extremely aspirational to ensure that they compete to achieve these in the future.









Subject in the Spotlight- MFL

What have we been learning in MFL this week?



Y7: In French, Mandarin and Spanish, students have completed their exams and went through an intensive revision session to help them reach the best of their potential. We are currently looking at the topic of food and how to order food in a French, Chinese and Spanish Restaurant. Students have recently enjoyed the conversation classes where they are being put into

role plays with their partners to help them practice. In French as part of the homework, they had to go and teach one of the conversations they have learnt in class to a family member and it was lovely to hear how much they enjoyed this. In Mandarin, the students have completed their speaking exams and have thoroughly.

Y8: Our students are currently learning about the topic of food and festivities. Through this theme they have explored Francophone and Hispanic food. Mandarin, the students are currently exploring China and Chinese traditions. This allowed us to build on our student's cultural capital, giving them an overview of the cultures and food. They have also been engaged into speaking and practicing scenarios of ordering food from a café and booking a room at a hotel. Students are making the most of the speaking sessions and some have developed some great accents. Make sure to ask them about what they like to eat if you catch them in the corridor.

Y9: In French and Spanish completed their exams and our students are learning about music festival in France, Spain and Latin American countries. We aim at building their cultural capital to learn about different cultures and food. They revisited vocabulary on food and are currently in the process of learning how to order food in a restaurant. Through the speaking sessions, the students will be equipped with the necessary tools through extensive practice to make them more confident learners and linguists. We are looking forward to hearing all about the trip to China for our Y9 Mandarin students!

Y10: The Y10 students have been practising speaking skills during the week as they completed the first speaking mock. They learned how to answer questions in a role play looking at different contexts, such as booking in a hotel or discussing social media with a journalist. The students have also practice how to maintain a conversation for two / three minutes using flashcards/notes. We are proud that they have understood the importance of this mock speaking, which is the only chance we have to practice this skill before the real GCSE exam. As well as preparing the speaking exam, students will now move to learn how to use the language to communicate in real-life situations (a restaurant, a hotel...).


