They are a chance to see the students, staff and school shine as we discuss what we are most passionate about: learning. As I joined various tour groups throughout the evening, led by our exceptional Prefect team, I noticed how much pride our students have in their school. Year 11 Prefects spoke with authority as they described the rationale behind our systems and explained how they plan to achieve outstanding results this year. I believe pupils are the best reflection of a school, and it gives me such pride to see just how well they represented us on Wednesday evening. I am now looking forward to our upcoming open mornings, where parents will be able to come in and see the school in action.



## Subject in the spotlight



This week's subject in the spotlight is.... MFL with the head of department, Mme Cabo.

**Year 7:** In French and Spanish students are learning to talk about their life and themselves in French. They have learnt how to give their name, age, physical description and personality and have also learn how to describe a family member. They will completing their first extended writing covering all the aspects that they have learnt. Students have also practiced conversation in the target language in lesson. Similarly, in Chinese, students are wrapping up their learning of numbers and ages and will soon explore Chinese greetings. They've already shown impressive progress in memorizing key vocabulary and writing Chinese characters.

**Year 8:** Students are covering the topic of Free time in Spanish and French where they were introduced to leisure activities: technology, films and music. They have learnt how to give their opinions about technology / free time activities and films. This week they will learn about the past tense in dept and they will be able to use the past tense to talk about what they did in their free time. In Chinese, learners are continuing their learning on the holiday unit, focusing on destinations like the seaside and mountains. This ties back to their previous studies on hobbies and food, making the lessons personal and relatable.

**Year 9:** Students are covering the topic of Family and relationships. They will revisit vocabulary they have seen in Y7 and will be introduced to GCSE vocabulary related to relationship. They are now learning about the near future and conditional tense to talk about marriage and ideal partners and relationships. By the end of the term, our students will become more confident in discussing about their family and plans for the future more confidently in French and Spanish. Similarly, in Chinese, students are building on what they've learned in earlier years about hobbies, routines, and personality. They are now linking their previous knowledge to express their opinions on important topics like friendship and community relationships.

**Year 10** has had a strong start, with great enthusiasm. In Mandarin, it has been impressive to see their engagement in lessons, especially after being inspired by their recent trip to China. They are now focused on describing people's appearances, combining familiar adjectives with new vocabulary. Next, they will explore comparisons and work with longer texts, connecting appearance to other key GCSE topics. In Spanish and French students have been revisiting the topic of free time and they have looked at how to give opinions about the activities they do.

**Year 11** Chinese students are completing the second-to-last topic of their GCSE curriculum, focusing on social issues, relationships, body image, and health. This unit allows them to reuse vocabulary from earlier topics like appearance, food, drink, and family, but now with a more sophisticated language structure. It's a perfect way for them to reflect on relevant issues and prepare for their upcoming exams. In Spanish and French, students are learning about 'free time' and developing their grammar skills by using different tenses. During this and next week, they will concentrate on how to talk about their role model and their achievements.
