Year 11 Mock exams

Mock exams for students in Year 11 begin on Monday 11th November. These exams are really important and will help you to see how your child is performing in each subject. Students have been given their exam timetable and revision manifests and should have started their revision over the half term break. We particularly recommend the following revision techniques:

- Self quizzing to learn definitions from a knowledge organiser (see <u>this video</u>)
- Testing yourself on flashcards using the Leitner system (see <u>this video</u>)
- Completing practice questions your teacher will provide you with these

Teachers will be supporting pupils with their revision during lesson time, so it is important for Year 11 students to be in school every day and to get plenty of rest each night. A copy of the timetable for week 1 can be found below:

Subject in the spotlight



This week's subject in the spotlight is.... Music with the head of department, Mr Clarke

Our Year 7 students are busy practicing their chosen instruments as part of our Class Band programme. They're divided into three groups: brass (trumpet or trombone), saxophone, and rhythm (piano or ukulele). This week, they've been learning to play 'Hot Cross Buns,' an English folk song, and they're also learning the difference between a semibreve, minim, and crotchet.

Year 8 is diving into Grieg's 'In The Hall of the Mountain King' from the play *Peer Gynt*. They're analysing how the dynamics and tempo change throughout the piece and how a fermata at the start creates tension and suspense.

Our Year 9 students are bringing back the jazz vibes through learning one of the most famous villain songs of all time: 'Cruella de Vil' from Disney's 101 Dalmatians. They're mastering swing rhythms and understanding the role of an anacrusis.

Our Year 10s are getting ready for their first solo performances, which they picked themselves. They're keeping a rehearsal diary to track their progress and set their own goals for improvement.

Year 11 Music students are revising for their upcoming listening and appraising mock exam. They've answered questions on a variety of unfamiliar pieces of music and are honing their analytical skills for the 10-mark question, which focuses on how a piece of music effectively portrays a particular mood or action.

Outside of lessons our Music Scholars are super busy, practicing hard in our Brass Groups and Saxophone Groups. We've also brought back our school choir and started a new Music Production club called StudioX: a club aimed at students that are interested in songwriting and digital beat-making. We're so proud of how committed they've been, and we can't wait to show off their amazing skills later this term!
