Year 7 Prep

We have very high standards here at The Hurlingham Academy, as such we set the bar very high for our students from the start. For the first two weeks of term, Year 7 stay after school each night do to Prep, during which they learn about the school routines and the etiquette that we

expect from everyone in our school to maintain our calm, disruption-free and purposeful learning environment. It has been fantastic to see the dedication and enthusiasm from all year 7's during this time.



Open Evening

We will be holding our Year 6 Open Evening on Wednesday 2nd October. In order for us to set up for the evening, **lessons will finish at 2.30pm on Wednesday 2nd**. There will also be a **late start on Thursday 3rd**, **when students should arrive at 9.30am** - this is to allow us to clear up after the event. Subject in the spotlight



This week's subject in the spotlight is.... maths with the head of department, Mme Kramer.

Year 7:

Last week all of Year 7 wrote their Baseline Test in Maths in order to best access their foundational number skills and to see if there are any gaps in their knowledge that need to be closed before moving on to the main unit of this term, *Algebra*. Based on the Baseline Test students may be moved into a different class to ensure they are in the most appropriate class for them!

Year 8:

Year 8 are just finishing up on the Powers and Roots unit, which builds on their knowledge of square and cube numbers from Year 7, as well as their knowledge of decimal multiplication and division by Powers of 10. The next unit Year 8 will be looking at is *Prime Factor Decomposition*. This topic builds on students' previous knowledge of multiples and factors and will also be continued when they are in Year 9.

Year 9:

Year 9 are just finishing up on the unit of *Decimal Manipulation*, where they reviewed adding, subtracting, dividing and multiplying with decimals, which is a key foundational skill while they are transitioning from KS3 to GCSE content. Their next unit will be *Rounding and Limits of Accuracy*, where they are revisiting topics from Year 7 and Year 8, such as rounding to different place values and rounding to significant figures, but they are also learning the new topics of *Error Intervals*.

Year 10:

Higher and foundation tier classes are both finishing the Solving Equations and Rearranging Formulae unit, which is an essential unit before moving onto Linear Graphs. This next unit is a big unit, which will bring in their knowledge of coordinates, midpoints and simple graphs, as well as their new algebraic skills!

Year 11:

Foundation classes are currently revisiting <u>all</u> of *Algebra* in order to prepare for the new topics in Year 11, such as *Trigonometry*, but also to start revising for their GCSEs. This topic will cover all the algebra they have learned since Yar 7!

Higher classes are finishing up on their *Recurring Decimal* unit and moving on to *Quadratic Sequences*. They will continue to work on new challenging algebraic topics for the Term 1, all building on their knowledge from KS3 and Year 10.



Year 8 Trip to the Royal Institute of Chemistry

On Friday and Tuesday, 48 Year 8 students embarked on an exciting trip to the Royal Institute of Chemistry, where they had the chance to experience hands-on science in a professional lab setting. Dressed in lab coats, gloves, and goggles, the students looked every bit the part of real scientists, eager to dive into their experiments.

The first group explored the world of cosmetics by learning about acids, alkalis, and the process of neutralisation. They even got the chance to create their own bath bombs! Using the wafting technique to safely smell various ingredients, the students carefully selected scents and colours for their unique creations, combining science with creativity.

Meanwhile, the second group took on a fascinating challenge: extracting DNA from their own cheek cells. This involved a scientific method known as "cheek chewing," which helped them gather the cells needed for their experiment. Using advanced lab equipment, such as micropipettes—typically reserved for university-level research—they successfully extracted their DNA, which they then preserved in a double-helix necklace to take home as a memento.

This trip provided a fantastic opportunity for students to conduct experiments outside the classroom and enhance their understanding of real-world science. Asking the students, they specifically enjoyed observing the reactions as they added substances when extracting DNA, choosing the scents to add to their bath bombs, seeing DNA and learning about cells.
