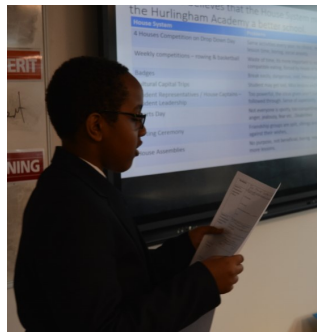
Year 7 Trip to PGL

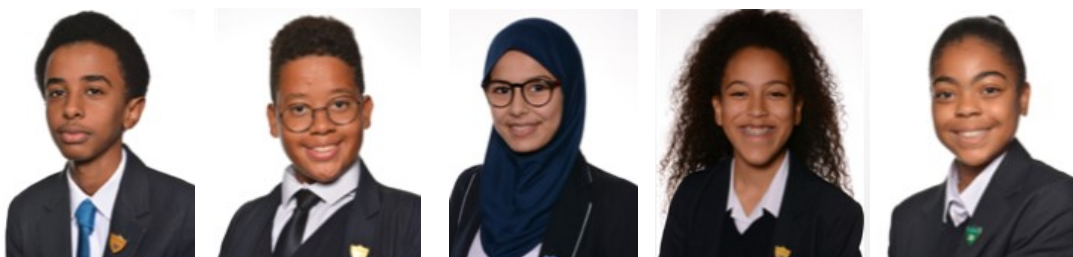
