The teacher meetings are set to strict timings and this means discussions will be extremely focused. Please ensure you arrive online at the correct time and come prepared with any questions, concerns or points for discussion regarding your child's progress. I hope you have a great week ahead and you enjoy the first slightly more relaxed weekend in a long time... I never thought I'd be so excited about having a cup of tea *inside* a café!

Pupil Absence

<u>Reminder</u>: parents and carers are asked most earnestly not to arrange non urgent appointments, such as dentist, GP appointments etc during school hours, except in the case of emergency, so that considerable interference with school work is avoided. We ask that appointments are made outside of school hours where possible so that we can maximise learning time for your child. Subject In The Spotlight!

This week's subject in the spotlight is.... **Science** with Mr Ives, Assistant Principal and Head of Science

In Science this week :



Year 7: are studying a topic on Ecological Relationships. So far, they have looked at food webs and how pesticides can build up in food chains. They will shortly be moving on to look at competition, adaptation and natural selection. Once this unit of work is completed, Year 7 will begin revision for their end of year exam, which will cover the topics Variation & Reproduction, Chemical Reactions and Forces. They should use their knowledge organisers, exercise books and Educake quizzes to revise.

Year 8: are learning about Plants & Photosynthesis. They have looked at the equation for photosynthesis and have learned how leaves are adapted for this process. As the Year 8s are based in the Science rooms, they have also had the opportunity to do some practical work, testing leaves for starch and investigating factors affecting the rate of photosynthesis. In June, the students will have their end of year exam, which will cover Ecological Relationships, Materials & the Earth and Electricity.

Year 9: We have been extremely impressed with our Year 9 students, who have shown great drive and focus as we begin studying GCSE Science topics. So far, we have looked at cells, microscopes and transport across membranes, and will shortly cover atoms, elements and the periodic table, before moving on to energy. Year 9 will also have an end of year exam in June, when they can be tested on any topic from Year 7-9.

Year 10: In Year 10, we have completed nearly 50% of the GCSE Science course. Students are currently studying Electricity, which is the last Paper 1 topic they need to cover. Their end of year exam will include all Paper 1 content, which is topics 1-4 in Biology and Physics and topics 1-5 in Chemistry. Once the end of year exams are completed, students will move onto studying Ecology.

Year 11: have been working hard in Science, in preparation for their final exams. We are really proud of all they have achieved and wish them the best of luck in their next endeavours. In their final weeks in school, we will be introducing students to some A-level Science topics and will look at Covid-19 and the immune system, exercise science, designer babies and the structure of the universe.


