Subject in the Spotlight



This week's subject in the spotlight is PE with Head of Department, Mme Mulcahey.

I's been another exciting week and term for the THA PE students as they continue to further their knowledge and understanding about diet, hydration, sleep, mental health, growth mindset and components of fitness.

Year 7: Have for the first-time experienced theory lessons in PE. They have been discussing mental health and its effects on performance in sport. The students have been full of questions on how they can improve their own mental health and have designed some support resources for anyone suffering with depression/ or other mental health issues. Year 7 PE students of the term are Charles, Yara, Mia, Jayden, Emmanuel and Adam H.

Year 8: Have also been enjoying PE theory lessons and have been looking into topics surrounding diet, hydration, and sleep. Students have discussed the differences between fats, carbohydrates and proteins and have even discovered recommended daily consumptions of sugar and water. Students are also aware of how much sleep they should be achieving each evening so they can function to their full potential each day. Year 8 PE students of the term are Archie, Khadijah, Lexi and Malakai.

Year 9: Have also been having GCSE PE taster theory lessons and have investigated mental health, high level performance, components of fitness and fitness testing. Year 9 PE students of the term are Abdullah, Ricki-Lee, Tasia, Darnell, Jack and Ibrahim.

Year 10 core: It has been a diverse few weeks for year 10 core as they have been getting to try out your more untraditional sports from around the world like street surfing/ ultimate frisbee, lacrosse and volleyball. The unit of work will continue until Easter and then we embark on athletics and striking and fielding games.

Year 10 BTEC: After working so hard in the run up to the mock two assessments we now take a break from UNIT 1 and begin a journey into practical performance analysis. Students will look at the rules and regulations of basketball, netball and rounder and learn to referee and lead activities. They will also learn and gain ways to analyse their own and other performances.

Year 11 BTEC: This course is coming to an end for many of our students as the coursework is nearly complete. Students are currently working through Unit 3 (PEP personal exercise programme) writing up their analysis. Discussing their strengths and areas for improvement.

Year 11 GCSE PE: Preparations have started for the PE moderation day which will be taking place on Wednesday 27th April. Students have been rehearsing moderation drills and techniques in boxing, 100m sprint, basketball, and netball. In theory lessons students have been interleaving and revising all topics from both exams but have been delving into more depth and looking at exam questions for the higher tariff topics across both papers.

Geography Trip

On Thursday, 68 Year 9 geographers went to Brighton to participate in wind energy workshops, facilitated by the Rampion centre. They learned how turbines turn wind into electricity for our homes, and had a go at designing their own off-shore windfarms, with all the pitfalls and hazards involved! The workshops were fantastic deeper dive into a vitally important topic, both for a GCSE geographer and those building a 'greener future' in light of changing global climates. Other parts of the day offered the chance to practice geographical skills - students carried out an investigation into the importance of tourism through primary and secondary data collection, and the day ended with a ride on the British Airways 360 Tower, 162m above the city! A fun, important and hot day that pupils will remember for a very long time, thank you to all staff involved.
