Year 7 have been learning about how to express basic information in Mandarin, Spanish and French. They have learnt how to say their name, age, birthday and siblings. French learners will soon move to Spanish for the second half term and Spanish learners will move to French until December.


Year 8 have been learning about technology and free time activities. They have started looking at how to express their views in the past tense. Students will soon start learning about arrangements to go out and different places in town.


