This week in **Business**, **Year 10** have been learning the best way to source capital for a business. They are learning how to gain quick influxes of finance in times of poor cash flow, and how to use bigger sums of capital to fund business growth. Which source of finance would be most appropriate for a business wanting to expand overseas, a bank loan or retained profit? They all have their benefits and drawbacks!

Year 10 Enterprise and Marketing have been using their accounting skills to calculate the revenue, total costs, profit and breakeven point for their Ice cream businesses. They have been using complex formulae to decide whether to increase the selling price of their ice creams or find a cheaper supplier. It takes patience and calculated risk to decide the best option for their business plan. Who will make the most profit? Wait to find out.

Year 11 Business students have been delving into the world of Globalisation. They are learning how importing and exporting products, commodities and services multi -nationally has an impact on stakeholders such as customers, government, suppliers and the environment. Ethics also has a lot to say about the exploitation of cheap labour and poor working conditions being used to complete mass scale production across the globe.

Finally, **Year 11 Enterprise and Marketing** are getting stuck in with their exam preparation. They are currently learning how businesses research the market and use market segmentation to find the perfect customer. Afterwards, Year 11 are learning how to calculate revenue, total costs and profit, and will even be able to draw, label and analyse a breakeven graph.




Dads Matter
