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Year 8 Football Match – Tuesday 14th March

This week, in the Mr. Wilson cup, the two schools went head-to-head in a Y8 football match. THA looking to avenge the Year 7 team's heavy defeat a few weeks ago.

THA started the game the stronger side with some lovely passing combinations between captain Kenzo and left-back Kairon - who earned himself a call up from the Year 7 squad. Hurlingham continue to knock on Elms door, with Bobby-Rae orchestrating everything from the centre of the pitch. Multiple through balls were played, chips over the top, and crosses into the box – but THA just could not find the opening goal. In the 16th minute, THA did get their breakthrough after Bobby-Rae, again, tries to pick out Courtney, who has made a fantastic run into the box. On Wednesday, we were very lucky to have Dr. Haltalli joining Year 10 and talk to them about her career as a stem cell research associate in Cambridge University.
