Subject in the Spotlight– Geography

Year 7: Year 7s have had a brilliant year so far, they've studied Earth Systems, followed by rivers and flooding, all of which include many new concepts and key words. They've now moved onto development and are learning how there are two different approaches to help countries develop quickly – 'Bottom-up'





and 'Top-down'. It's been a brilliant course with so many fantastic ques-

tions being asked throughout! We're also gearing up to our next conservation day on the final week of term, hopefully a bit warmer then the last one!

Year 8: Year 8 studied migration and population before Christmas, and after the assessments have now moved on the tectonics. We've been looking at how the inner core is the 'engine room' for all the rock cycle, and how the continents move with devastating but fascinating consequences.

Year 9: It's only a couple of weeks to the Year 9 Brighton trip! We'll be hitting Brighton beachfront to study renewable energy and windfarms, with enough time to go up the i360 tower

and stop for an ice cream along the way! Earlier in the year,

Year 9 studied my favourite course, 'Emerging Economies', looking at the vast trends of urbanisation and migration in the emerging world.

Year 10: The Year 10s have just finished their mock exams, having studied global hazards, development and coastal fieldwork. After feedback we'll head on to 'urbanising world', and before long we'll be studying the major case study, Mumbai. It's another personal

favourite, with many opportunities to talk about cricket throughout!

Year 11: Similarly, the Y11s have just finished their mock exam on paper one. We'll be feeding back soon and in the meantime carrying on paper two revision – not long to go now to the GCSEs! Our Y11s have shown great maturity in the last few weeks and we're looking forward to seeing how their hard work pays off!

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Sparx Science

We are excited to announce that the Science department will be launching Sparx with Year 8 next week, after it has been so successful in supporting students with their Maths and English work. Here's what you need to know:

Year 8s will be set Sparx Science every other Wednesday, starting Wednesday 20th March (NB - Sparx Maths and Sparx Reader are set every week). They will have a week to complete their homework.


To access their homework, students should search 'Sparx Science' and use their existing Maths/English login

Students should find the week's homework and will need to work through each question until the homework is 100% complete.

When a student gets a question wrong, Sparx will provide them with extra information to help them, plus a slightly easier version of the question - but students should see their teacher if they are still struggling.

Over time, Sparx Science will learn what level students are working at and will be able to set questions at the most appropriate level of difficulty. It will also build in questions on topics they've struggled with in the past, to help them improve in these areas.


