It has been a very creative week in the Media department, as many of our students complete their coursework projects. The students have been working so hard, taking ownership over producing websites, branding, short films and advertisements independently, and we cannot wait to see the final products!



Year 10

Our GSCE group have been consolidating their knowledge of the Radio case studies, bringing together everything they have studied on Kiss Breakfast with hosts Jordan and Perri of Diversity fame and their understanding of commercial radio structure, production and ownership. The students have worked hard this week to improve their exam skills, producing thoughtful and developed responses to 20-mark questions that evaluate the success of various breakfast radio products and apply their knowledge of audience theory. Next week, we will move on to exploring print media in the form of magazines Heat and Tatler. Our BTEC group have been finalising their first pieces of coursework, which has seen students create their own charity brands and educational websites for a target audience of young people. Students have had complete creative autonomy over this project and have each chosen to spotlight current issues that are important to them. Their websites look incredibly professional, gaining vital tech skills for the future beyond the classroom!

Year 11

Our Y11 BTEC group are putting the final touches to the final component of their course. The students have each used their skills and knowledge gained over the past two years to create websites in response to a brief that requires them to create a piece of interactive media promoting a new fitness and physical activity brand. The students are now in their 'post-production' phase, producing their technical logs and analysing the design choices they have made. Our GCSE group have just completed their coursework project which saw them produce either a series of short advertisements to engage young people in careers in mental health care, or create an online promotional package for a pop artist, including a website and social media presence. They are also now working hard with their revision for the upcoming Media exams – we wish them the best of luck!
