This is a life story that has only recently come to be known publicly. John Smythe was born in Sierra Leone and served Britain in the RAF in WWII. He was captured in Germany and spent time in a POW camp. He then served as senior officer on the Windrush as it sailed into Britain where he

oversaw the settling of many of the Windrush generation into UK life. His life was one dedicated to public service and is inspirational. It was a privilege for our students to see what an ordinary boy from West Africa could become and to be inspired by the legacy of a life committed to public service. End of year exams for all students in Years 7-10 will begin on Monday 10th June. This is a great chance for all students to show off what they have learned this year.

Students have been given their exam timetable and revision manifests (also available here) and should start their revision over the half term break. We particularly recommend the following revision techniques:



- Self quizzing to learn definitions from a knowledge organiser (see this video)
- Testing yourself on flashcards using the Leitner system (see this <u>video</u>)
- Completing practice questions your teacher will provide you with these

Teachers will be giving out lots of revision tips in lessons after half term, so it's important for students to be in school every day and to get plenty of rest each night.


