This week's subject in the spotlight is.... Science with Mme Deng.

Year 7:

Y7 have started their Science journey at THA learning about particles, which make up everything! They have learnt how particles behave in different states of matter and how everyday phenomena occur, such as diffusion and gas pressure. Y7 have also learnt about how to work in a Science lab safely as they start carry out Science practicals. Students will learn about Cell Biology next.

Year 8:

Y8 have started the year learning about atoms, and how they make up everything. Students are learning the differences between elements, mixtures, and compounds, and they will continue to look at metals and non-metals. In the next unit, Y8 will learn about diet and nutrition.

Year 9:

Y9 have started the year learning about different organ systems such as the skeletal system and the respiratory system. Students are also looking at lifestyle and diseases, learning the effects of smoking and alcohol on the human health. Next up, students will move on to Chemistry and learn about reactivity.

Year 10:

Year 10 students are learning about the digestive system, the circulatory system, and the long term effects of different lifestyle choices and risk factors on health. After this, students will be moving on to Structure and Bonding in Chemistry, learning about the properties and uses of various compounds.

Year 11:

Students are about to finish up the unit on Homeostasis and Response where they looked at how the nervous system works, how different hormones regulate internal conditions in the body, the menstrual cycle, contraception, and treating infertility. After this, Y11 will move on to Forces in Physics, looking at Newton's Laws and how they apply.
