


























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### Year 7 PGL

#### Free School Meals

We encourage all families to apply for Free School Meals, even if they are unsure if they are eligible. The new FSM application system is now live and we would appreciate all parents making a new application to check their eligibility and to update their details on the portal here <a href="https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/thehurlinghamacademy">https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/thehurlinghamacademy</a> by completing the online form.

Please speak to the Office if you have any questions or need help.

Free School Meals are available to any full-time student who is still at school and eligible. Meals are not available for students at further education level. You can get Free School Meals for your child if you or your partner gets either:

- → Income Support.
- → Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- → Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- ◆ Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- → The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs.

Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after their employment ceases, or after they start to work less than 16 hours per week, their children are entitled to free school lunches. Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also eligible to receive Free School Meals
