Please bring your donations to the school reception between Monday and Friday, 8:00am – 4:00pm. We will be collecting items until Friday, 14th November.


Your generosity will make a real difference to families who are struggling to recover and rebuild. Together, we can show solidarity and compassion in a time of great need.







