Mr Wilson's Weekly Message



As Principal of our school, this has been a week filled with proud moments. 

Pride takes part every year in June.

Pride is a colourful celebration of people coming together in love and friendship, to show how far LGBTQ+ rights have come, and how there's still work to be done. It calls for the community to be treated fairly, safely, and with respect.

LGBTQ+ stands for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer/Questioning. The + (plus) is there to include a wide range of other sexualities and gender identities. The terms refer to how people feel about their gender and/or who they love.

Mental health and LGBTQ+ rights are deeply connected. LGBTQ+ people face higher rates of discrimination and exclusion - factors that can have a serious impact on mental wellbeing.

- Half of LGBTQ+ people in the UK reported experiencing depression in the past year
- Two-thirds of trans people have experienced hate crime

These figures remind us why Pride matters - and why it's **everybody's responsibility to treat each other with kindness, understanding, and respect.**

Sexuality and gender identity are protected characteristics, meaning it is illegal to discriminate against people for being LGBTQ+.

- <u>Gendered Intelligence</u> offers in-person supportive spaces for young to meet other trans, nonbinary and gender-questioning people (ages 8-25)


