



## Mr Wilson's Weekly Message



Welcome back and Happy New Year to all of our parents, students, staff, governors, and members of our local community. I have a strong feeling that 2026 is going to be a very good year.

Over the Christmas break, I had the privilege of travelling back to Jamaica to support the distribution of all the funds raised by The Hurlingham Academy last term. Thanks to these funds, together with an incredibly generous £1,500 donation from Kai in Year 8, we were able to purchase an entire one-bedroom house for an elderly lady

who lost everything in the hurricane. She was overwhelmed with gratitude, and her son will begin construction later this week.

In addition, we provided building and roofing materials for five more families who also lost their homes. We purchased 16 laying chickens, each named after Year 11 pupils and staff who contributed to this effort, as well as a further 100 baby chickens, which were shared between two families, along with feed and all necessary supplies. The community has been incredibly thankful and has shown remarkable resilience in their daily lives. I cannot thank our parents, staff, and pupils enough for your generosity and support.

What has been most striking is the scale of devastation in some of the poorest communities. Rebuilding will take years, but despite this, the community remains determined to return to normal life following Hurricane Melissa. This experience has made me reflect on just how fortunate we are to live where we do, with access to what many consider basic necessities; heating, electricity, and a school building that allows us to welcome pupils every day. It has strengthened my determination to make 2026 the best year yet here at The Hurlingham Academy.

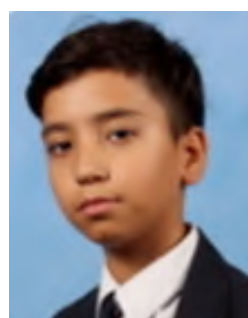
