

## Subject in the Spotlight



This week's subject in the spotlight is Modern Foreign Languages (MFL), with Head of Department, Miss Cabo.

This week in: MFL...

**Year 7** students have been learning about what they do in their free time. We have also looked at how to express opinions and justifications about those activities and how to expand the sentences adding who with. They have started to learn about grammar and how to 'conjugate' different verbs to refer to other people. Most students have completed an extended writing in French/Spanish.

In **Year 8**, students have learnt about food in Spanish-Speaking countries and how to talk about their daily routine. We have revised reflexive verbs and how to talk about sports they do and play in their free time. This is linked to the topic of healthy living, which they will continue studying after half-term.

In **Year 9**, students have recently started the topic of festivals and customs. They have been learning about different food from different Spanish-speaking countries with special focus on the ingredients you need to prepare them. They have had a look at specific vocabulary to describe well-known festivals around the world and they have worked on how to compare them with festivals in the UK.

In **Year 10**, students have learnt about the topic of school. During this term, students have been able to express their opinion about the subjects they like and dislike and they have also described teachers in school. They have learnt how to give positive and negative arguments about wearing the uniform and other rules at THA and they have talked about problems in school and after school-activities.

In **Year 11**, students have finished with the last topic of the GCSE: jobs. They have learnt how to talk about jobs they would like to pursue in the future, as well as other plans when they are older. They have talked about past experiences job-related, and they have learnt how to apply for jobs writing a personal statement in Spanish.
