This week in: English




Year 7: For our first reading unit, Year 7 are enjoying exploring a range of new and exciting contemporary fiction. This week they are beginning three brilliant narratives: *Ghost Boys*, *The Jungle* and *A Kind of Spark*. Each text will immerse them in new and interesting parts of the world and will encourage students to consider themes of social injustice, tolerance and discrimination. We can't wait to hear their ideas!

Year 8: For our first Autumn unit Year 8 are studying one of Shakespeare's darkest and most diabolical plays: *Richard III*. Students are invited to explore the mind of a true Machiavellian villain and consider the extent to which an audience can sympathise with a moral deviant!

Year 9: For our first unit, Year 9 are studying Shakespeare's famous tragedy- *Romeo and Juliet*. Students will be delving into the rich language used to present the juxtaposing themes of romantic passion and brutal conflict...and considering the BIG question: can love really cure all?

Year 10: For the Autumn term unit Year 10 are exploring Stevenson's famous mystery, '*The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr Hyde*'. Students will pull apart this tense and twisted narrative, exploring themes of addiction, madness and duplicity. Ultimately they will consider: is it possible that we are all 'monsters beneath our masks'?

Year 11: For our first unit Year 11 will be grappling with Shakespeare's *Macbeth*. Full of murderous plots, supernatural entanglements and cruel betrayal - our literary analysis will focus on understanding and responding to Shakespeare's complex intentions towards his Jacobean audience. So far, their enthusiasm for discussion has been highly enthusiastic, keep it up guys!
